Due to the current restrictions and limitations for social distancing and gatherings surrounding the COVID-19 crisis, the September 3, 2020, City of Jacksonville Beach, City Council special meeting will be conducted in a modified manner. Governor DeSantis' Executive Order No. 20-193, extended the Governor's authorization for local government bodies to continue to conduct meetings without an in-person quorum at any specific location, and to hold meetings using communications media technology (CMT). 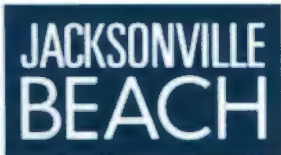

ACTION REQUESTED

The purpose of this meeting is to hold a public hearing for the adoption of the Proposed Millage Rate and Tentative Operating Budget for the fiscal year beginning October 1, 2020 and ending September 30, 2021. These items are being held at a Special Meeting to comply with State Statutes.

BACKGROUND

The first item to be discussed is the Proposed Millage Rate. The tentative operating budget has been prepared using an unchanged millage rate of \$3.9947 per \$1,000 of assessed taxable value, 19.98% lower than the statewide average of \$4.9923.

- The total millage levied by all taxing authorities in the County continues to decline. In 2016, the total millage was \$19.4997. The proposed total millage for the 2021 budget year is \$18.5614. Therefore, the overall tax rate to our citizens continues to be reduced.
- Total assessed value increased by \$224,261,184 or 5.86%, which includes new construction of \$42,647,521.
- Using the planned 2021 millage rates, a homeowner in Jacksonville Beach with an assessed median value of \$236,748 (and a homestead exemption of \$50,000) can expect to pay \$3,620 in property taxes. Of that amount, \$746 (or \$62.16 per month) will be paid to the City of Jacksonville Beach.
- Currently, the 'Save our Homes' amendment limits the annual increase on homesteaded property to the lower of 3% or the annual percent change in the Consumer Price Index. This reduces valuation increases for homesteaded residents.

The second item to be discussed is the Tentative Operating Budget. The Tentative Operating Budget for Fiscal Year 2020-2021 is \$164,824,450. The tentative operating budget is \$931,848, or 0.6%, higher than the current year's budget.

The **General Fund's** proposed budget is \$23,792,976, 1% less than the current year. While property taxes represent 53% of General Fund's revenues, 55% of the General Fund's total budget is used to pay for police and fire services.

As we prepared the budget for FY2021, we found, and continue to find, ourselves facing a great deal of uncertainty due to the COVID-19 pandemic. While other governments have had to implement, and plan for, reductions in the current and in the coming fiscal year, the budget I am presenting will allow our City to continue to provide a level of services that our citizens expect. Additionally, our City is fortunate to find itself in the position of being debt free in October 2020.

As stewards of the taxpayer resources that make possible the services that are essential to our community, we will continue to manage these resources conservatively and responsibly.

The staff and City Council held five workshops to discuss all facets of the budget. Monetary changes which have occurred since the workshops are as follows:

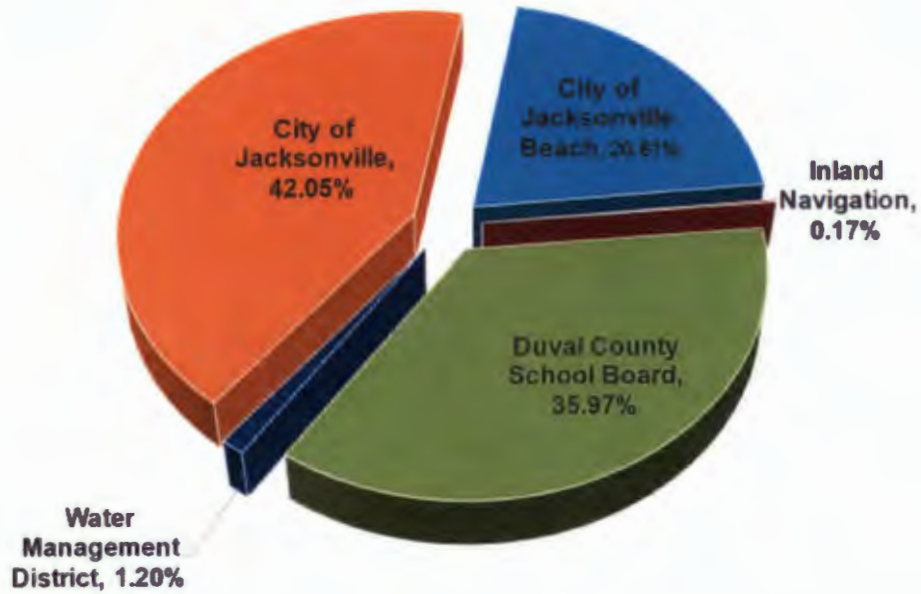

BACKGROUND

The City Councils of Neptune Beach, Jacksonville Beach, and Atlantic Beach adopted Resolutions that supported safety improvements to Penman Road and requested the City of Jacksonville (COJ) to plan and design the improvement project, and place funds for construction into its five-year Capital Improvements Plan. These Resolutions were transmitted to the Office of Mayor Lenny Curry in April 2019.

The City of Jacksonville Beach procured the services of Glatting-Jackson in 2007 to develop a concept rendering of improvements to Penman Road to improve pedestrian and bicyclist safety, roadway drainage systems, and the general aesthetics of the roadway corridor. The City of Neptune Beach procured the services of Dover, Kohl & Partners in 2019 to assist with modifications to its Comprehensive Plan and Land Development Regulations and, in the course of such services, Dover, Kohl & Partners have also developed concept renderings of improvements to Penman Road to improve pedestrian and bicyclist safety, roadway drainage systems, and the general aesthetics of the roadway corridor.

A “complete streets” concept for improvements to Penman Road, and safety improvements for pedestrians and bicyclists, turning movements at vehicle/pedestrian conflict points, improved drainage, and aesthetics serve a substantial public interest and help to protect the safety, health, and welfare of the public.

The proposed Joint Resolution between the cities of Jacksonville Beach and Neptune Beach, requests the COJ to plan and design Complete Streets Improvements to Penman Road, and for the COJ to retain in its final budget for Fiscal Year 2021 the funds for construction of improvements to Penman Road.

JOINT RESOLUTION

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITIES OF JACKSONVILLE BEACH AND NEPTUNE BEACH REQUESTING THE CITY OF JACKSONVILLE TO PLAN AND DESIGN COMPLETE STREETS IMPROVEMENTS TO PENMAN ROAD TO ADDRESS PEDESTRIAN AND BICYCLIST SAFETY, VEHICLE TURNING MOVEMENTS AT VEHICLE/PEDESTRIAN CONFLICT POINTS, DRAINAGE, AND AESTHETICS.

WHEREAS, Penman Road is classified as a “major collector road” owned and maintained by the City of Jacksonville, running between Atlantic Boulevard (State Road 10) and Beach Boulevard (State Road 212); and

WHEREAS, Penman Road consists of three lanes of travel (north, south, and center turning) between the Cities of Atlantic Beach, Neptune Beach, and Jacksonville Beach, providing adequate vehicular capacity in both directions to all three communities; and

WHEREAS, Penman Road provides relief to traffic on State Road A1A by providing a means for north/south travel within and among the beach communities away from the State highway system; and

WHEREAS, Penman Road is used as a school walking and bicycling route by students within a two-mile radius of San Pablo Elementary School, Duncan U. Fletcher Middle School, and Duncan U. Fletcher High School; and

WHEREAS, Penman Road lacks sufficient crossings for pedestrians to traverse safely from the east or west side of the road to the other; and

WHEREAS, Penman Road lacks sufficient bicycling lanes for the safe sharing of the road by both automobiles and bicycles; and

WHEREAS, Penman Road contains open drainage swales on both sides of the roadway, contributing to difficulties for both pedestrians and bicyclists; and

WHEREAS, the City of Jacksonville Beach procured the services of Glatting-Jackson in 2007 to develop a concept rendering of improvements to Penman Road to improve pedestrian and bicyclist safety, roadway drainage systems, and the general aesthetics of the roadway corridor; and

WHEREAS, on September 4, 2018, the City of Neptune Beach adopted via Resolution 2018-07 a Complete Streets Policy to prioritize safe, convenient, and accessible transportation for all users; and

WHEREAS, the City of Neptune Beach procured the services of Dover, Kohl & Partners in 2019 to assist with modifications to its Comprehensive Plan and Land Development Regulations and, in the course of such services, Dover, Kohl & Partners has also developed concept renderings of improvements to Penman Road to improve pedestrian and bicyclist safety, roadway drainage systems, and the general aesthetics of the roadway corridor; and

WHEREAS, according to the Jacksonville Metropolitan Statistical Area, Penman Road remains one of the country's most dangerous areas for pedestrians, ranking No. 6 nationally on a "pedestrian danger index" according to the 2019 Dangerous By Design report published by Smart Growth America; and

WHEREAS, the City Council of Neptune Beach adopted Resolution No. 2019-04, the City Council of Jacksonville Beach adopted Resolution No. 2031-2019, and the City Council of Atlantic Beach adopted Resolution No. 19-20, each of which supported safety improvements to Penman Road and requested the City of Jacksonville to plan and design the improvement project, and place funds for construction into its five-year Capital Improvements Plan; these Resolutions were transmitted to the Office of Mayor Lenny Curry in April 2019; and

WHEREAS, the Cities of Jacksonville Beach and Neptune Beach find that a "complete streets" concept for improvements to Penman Road, and safety improvements for pedestrians and bicyclists, turning movements at vehicle/pedestrian conflict points, improved drainage, and aesthetics serve a substantial public interest and help to protect the safety, health, and welfare of the public.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCILS OF THE CITIES OF JACKSONVILLE BEACH, FLORIDA, AND NEPTUNE BEACH, FLORIDA, THAT:

SECTION 1. The Cities of Jacksonville Beach and Neptune Beach request that the City of Jacksonville employ "complete streets" concept for improvements to Penman Road, and that the project address safety improvements for pedestrians and bicyclists, turning movements at vehicle/pedestrian conflict points, drainage, and aesthetics.

SECTION 2. The Cities request that the City of Jacksonville begin planning and designing for improvements to Penman Road in Fiscal Year 2021.

SECTION 3. The Cities request that the City of Jacksonville retain in its final budget for Fiscal Year 2021 the funds for construction of improvements to Penman Road included in the proposed budget for such Fiscal Year.


