DOWNTOWN ADA COMPLIANT DUNE WALKOVER REPLACEMENT PROJECT

(6th Ave. S., Beach Blvd. & 6th Ave. N.)

PROJECT OVERVIEW

Removal & replacement of three (3) existing ADA compliant dune walkovers abutting the Atlantic Ocean at 6th Ave. S., Beach Blvd. and 5th Ave. N. Work will include the following items:

- Setting up and maintaining temporary site fencing and erosion control around each of the sites.
- Demolition and disposal of the existing timber ADA compliant dune walkover structures to an approved offsite landfill.
- Furnishing & installing new wooden piles and composite type decking materials to construct the new ADA compliant dune walkovers at each of the sites.
- Performing general cleaning up of area disturbed during construction. Including grading, landscaping, and removal of temporary site fencing & erosion control materials.

Materials from all three (3) of the old dune walkovers have been removed and the debris has been hauled off to an approved landfill site.

The normal work hours for this project will be performed between 8:00 AM and 5:00 PM, Monday through Friday. During the demolition, disposal and construction phase of the project you will be experiencing loud noises from workers utilizing circular saws, nail guns and operating heavy equipment, while the dune walkovers are being removed and replaced.
