The Jacksonville Beach Police Department was notified by the Florida Law Enforcement Liaison Program and the Florida Department of Transportation that we placed 1st based on our agency's size category in the Florida Law Enforcement Liaison Traffic Safety Challenge. We competed against 38 other agencies! We were recognized in an awards ceremony on Friday, July 28, in Orlando, Florida. This challenge recognized our efforts in developing and implementing a comprehensive traffic safety program that may make a significant and positive impact in our community by reducing traffic-related crashes, injuries, and fatalities. We accomplished this despite the temporary reassignment of traffic officers to patrol duties because of staffing shortages due to retirements. All of our officers have embraced traffic enforcement/safety as evidenced by this award. We sent five of our top performers to accept the award on the department's behalf (See Facebook Post). Traffic safety will always remain a priority for this agency!
