Greetings,

I hope each of you enjoyed the holiday season, and I hope you have a great new year! We remained busy throughout December.

Our honor guard team and many members of the department participated in and assisted with the funeral ceremony for Officer Sam Owens (Ret.). Sam will always be a beloved member of our department, and he will be missed. (See Facebook).

We held our Annual Christmas Party for Kids at City Hall. Although the weather was poor, we had a great turnout. All of our wonderful volunteers and Sergeant Tator did an outstanding job putting everything together. Mr. and Mrs. Claus (Dean and Sandra Prince) also ensured a great success! (See Facebook).

We participated in the "Drive Sober or Get Pulled Over" national campaign for the last two weeks of December. Despite being shorthanded, we made 30 DUI arrests, with the traffic unit effecting 22 of those arrests. (See Facebook).

Members from our traffic team and Downtown CAPE Unit, joined by officers from Neptune Beach Police and Florida Highway Patrol, conducted a "Wolf Pack" task force as part of the "Celebrate Safely" impaired driver initiative. This campaign was created to help reduce alcohol-related traffic deaths and injuries throughout the holiday season. Together, they conducted 71 traffic stops resulting in 9 arrests. One of those arrests was a DUI with a charge of armed possession of cocaine/marijuana with intent to sell. (See Facebook). Downtown CAPE, despite also being shorthanded, continued to be proactive in their enforcement activity in the Community Redevelopment Area. They also dealt effectively with several large events, including Deck the Chairs and the Gator Bowl Pep Rally. There were no critical incidents downtown and comparatively few arrests with the tens of thousands of visitors who came to the area.

We held an applicant processing day where 12 prospective police applicants participated; this produced four viable candidates. We are expecting them to start work with us in early January. This was the largest police applicant group we have had in two years. We also hired a dispatcher with extensive experience from an agency in Georgia. Additionally, an officer that was deployed with the military for a year returned to work this month. We hired him last year around this time, and he has prior experience from another agency. He was able to complete half his training last year and picked up this month where he left off. We are expecting him and another trainee to finish training in January.
